Scott's All\*Stars program is an academic/basketball program for students who have the potential to attend college and play basketball at the college level. Students must have an 80 GPA, no discipline problems, and perform community service activities. We teach life skills that will prepare them to be successful students and productive citizens. Our mission is "to teach basketball and life skills to young men who have the potential academically and athletically to play basketball on the college level". Our vision is to remain with our team members until they graduate from high school by placing them in a mentoring program that will continue to motivate them to reach their academic, athletic and community goals.

We are very proud of our team's progress this year and the community support we received. Without supportive parents and community supporters this program would not be as successful. Scott's All\*Stars' theme for our award ceremony this year is "Greatness is Expected with Excellence". Our program is unique in that we require community service from our players. This ensures they develop strong character. We mandate that our kids be respectful and academically sound. Furthermore, we instill in our kids the expectation that they will graduate from college. Being an All\*Star is very demanding, but worth it! Scott's All\*Stars is committed to helping children academically and athletically, but it requires a major commitment from players and parents. Our parents and players commit to this program for six months and once they become "All\*Stars", they are always "All\*Stars". With the expectation of excellence we are expected to exhibit greatness. We strive to ensure the outcome of our program will be greatness.

When I started this program in January of 2010, I couldn't imagine it would grow as quickly and become as successful as it has over the last three years. In only our third season, we have helped mentored over 100 kids, played in over 200 games, performed over 100 hours of community service, and visited over 30 colleges, with students in grades ranging from 4<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>. We are provide that we are providing more kids with a vision to attend and graduate from college. We truly feel that Scott's All\*Stars will have an epic impact on kids graduating college in this area on academic and/or athletic scholarships. I personally guarantee that all kids who are in our program from elementary to high school will receive one or more college scholarships. The academic behaviors they learn in our program will ensure college success.

Kerwin "Buck" Harris



Kerwin "Buck" Harris has played a vital role in the turnaround of the Fighting Camel program. Now in his third year in Buies Creek, he joined the Campbell staff during the summer of 2004 from Augusta State University, where he served as assistant coach from 1995-2004.

"First and foremost, Buck Harris is a great fit for Campbell University. He and his family are people of faith and high moral character," said head coach Robbie Laing. "Buck is a tremendous teacher who has developed a great rapport with our players."

Harris is involved in all facets of the up-and-coming Fighting Camel program, including on-court coaching, skill development and recruiting.

In the 2005-06 season, The Fighting Camels ended the year as the country's second-highest scoring team, and only one other school among 334 NCAA Division I members boasted a greater jump in conference victories from 2004-05.

Along the way, the Camels shattered school records for scoring, 3-point field goals made and attempted and rebounds, while winning more than twice as many Atlantic Sun Conference games as in the previous three seasons combined. Campbell led the A-Sun in scoring (82.8), rebounds per game (39.2),

3-point field goals made per game (9.86), rebounding margin (+3.4), offensive rebounds (15.75) and assists (17.0).

During his first year with the Fighting Camels (2004-05), Campbell posted a positive rebounding margin for the first time since the 1993-94 season. Four Fighting Camels were named to the Atlantic Sun Conference All-Academic Team and Ruell Pringle earned a spot on the A-Sun All-Freshman Team.

Over his seven years at Augusta State, Harris assisted head coach Gary Truell and played a key role in helping lead the Jaguars to a 113-89 (.559) record, including five Peach Belt Athletic Conference North Division titles and two NCAA Division II Tournament appearances. Augusta State finished first or second in the PBAC North in each of the last six years.

After graduating from Augusta State, Harris began his collegiate coaching career as an assistant at South Carolina State in 1994 before returning to his alma mater one year later.

He also served as head coach of the Augusta Metros AAU team from 1991-94 and led that team to a second-place showing in the national AAU tournament.

At Augusta State, Harris was involved in all aspects of the men's basketball program, including operations and recruiting, strength and conditioning, implementing practice plans and budget management. He also served as head men's and women's cross country coach.

Harris played two years at Augusta State after transferring from Midland (Texas) Junior College. During his career, he played in all 58 games for the Jags, starting 27 at guard, and averaging 5.4 points and 2.4 rebounds per contest. He was a member of Augusta's 1991 squad that advanced to the Big South Conference championship game before the program moved to the Division II Peach Belt.

Harris and his wife, the former Dawn Tucker of Big Springs, Texas, have three sons Demetrius, Daniel and Daethan.

#### HISTORY

The vision for Scott's All\*Stars began when Marcus Scott, IV, noticed the absence of basketball programs designed for children his son's age in the Hinesville area. Mr. Scott was determined that his son, Marcus Scott, V, and other kids, would not have to wait until they got to high school to face the level of competition that kids 10 and under in the North Georgia area were facing in middle school. Marcus Scott began conducting research in order to discover the best way to implement such a program in Liberty County.

During his research, Mr. Scott realized that while AAU was a great way for kids to gain basketball exposure, it lacked one essential piece - an academic component. Scott recognized that by not making it mandatory that players strive for academic excellence, along with athletic development, players would gain a false sense of what was necessary for success in life. Using this as his foundation, Scott designed a program which not only requires the players to have passing grades, but to maintain an 80 grade point average. According to Scott, Scott's All\*Stars was created not to be a basketball program, but an academic program that incorporates basketball training and exposure, while ensuring students are exhibiting academic excellence. Scott also wanted the players to always feel a need to give back to the community. This prompted him to add a community service element to his program.

Scott's vision became a reality on January 15, 2010, when Scott's All\*Stars program held it first tryouts conducted by president Marcus Scott, IV, head coach Daryl West and assistant coaches Khari Collins and Kevin Corwick. The program has grown from 12 young men in its first year, to four teams of over 40 players last year. This year, due to funding and the number of qualified coaches, Scott's All\*Stars only had two teams of 16 players. The quality of this program is now known throughout the state of Georgia which is a testament to the commitment of its founder and coaching staff, the hard work of its players, and the support of its parents.

Scott's All\*Stars continues its pursuit of academic and athletic distinction by teaching players that average is below average and excellence is what is expected. Attending college is a goal that is engrained into the young men at an early age and cultivated by Scott's All\*Stars. Mr. Scott feels that the earlier kids start thinking about college, the more likely they will attend college. This is why on every road trip Scott's All\*Stars' players are given the opportunity to visit local universities. They have visited colleges around the country, traveling to places such as New York and California. It is during college trips that students gain lifelong experiences that are unforgettable.


Scott's All\*Stars is not a basketball program, but an academic program that incorporates basketball training and exposure, while ensuring students are exhibiting academic excellence. Scott All\*Stars' coaches are committed to working with players until they graduate from high school and attend college. The team's goal is for all players to receive college scholarships for academics, basketball, or both! Scott's All\*Stars is committed to making sure all kids who remain in the program from elementary to high school graduation receive college scholarships. All players are expected to not only attend college, but graduate from a four-year institution. Mr. Scott and his staff will continue to provide academic assistance until they graduate from high school and in college, if necessary.

In its first year, Scott's All\*Stars quickly became a premier program with many established organizations mimicking the blueprint that has made Scott's All\*Stars successful. Our teams are committed to the ABC's of Scott's All\*Stars: Academics first, which is evident by our program overall average GPA of 87 for three years in a row; Basketball training, which is evident by our team success on the court, having a player ranked in the national in our program and a team that placed in the Top 8 in the nation and playing in over 200 games in 3 years; Community Service and College visits. Our players have completed over 100 hours of community service and visited over thirty colleges in three years; Drug Prevention and Dedicated mentors. We teach drug prevention and all of our coaches are dedicated mentors. Furthermore, we provide Educational assistance to any student whose grades fall below an 80 GPA.

Also eight out of eight of our seniors went to college, in the military, or received a scholarship with our first 2012 graduating class. Four players received athletic scholarships, one received academic scholarship, two will be attending college, and one will be joining the military. We feel if we can have these result with one year of working with juniors in high school, kids that started with us in the fourth grade will definitely receive an academic and/or athletic scholarship.


