Antwan Lang born to the name Antwan Tierre Wallace was born on January 22 1994, to Diane Wallace and Anthony Jackson. His story begins with the struggle of drugs and alcohol with his biological mother and a never ending cycle of incarceration with his father. Due to these event Mr. Lang was placed in the Chatham county department of Children services at birth and resulted in going from foster home to foster until age 4. Even while in the foster care system Antwan began his life of service by volunteering and shadowing those who would put together events and allow him to help. When adopted in 1998 this young man's journey began again with his new parents Thomas and Joanne Lang.

According to Case workers and studies done by physicians his formative years were quite extraordinary. His mother battle with substance abuse had no birth defects to Antwan and clearly no emotional affects either. Antwan Believes that's it's his history that makes him motivate to help and inspire people. When He speaks at schools and youth organizations along with business conventions people marvel at his story and how he has overcome so much and accomplished more in his 20 years of living than most 30 to 40 year olds.

A few of his accomplishments and ways he gives back to his community includes representing his School and City at the National Youth Leadership on Law and CSI. Here he was chosen out of 500 other participants based on his Confidence and appearance to deliver the opening remarks. Many were inspired by his story. Antwan loves to see people have a new outlook on life and to never allow adversity to steer you away from your Goals. Whether Volunteering at the homeless Shelters, mentoring young people at local schools, raising money for non-profits, or just giving back through time by visiting and meeting with local business owners to develop ways of city engagement, Antwan is destine to serve people and it is his passion to help others to strive for excellence. HISTORY

The vision for Scott's All*Stars began when Marcus Scott, IV, noticed the absence of basketball programs designed for children his son's age in the Hinesville area. Mr. Scott was determined that his son, Marcus Scott, V, and other kids, would not have to wait until they got to high school to face the level of competition that kids 10 and under in the North Georgia area were facing in middle school. Marcus Scott began conducting research in order to discover the best way to implement such a program in Liberty County.

During his research, Mr. Scott realized that while AAU was a great way for kids to gain basketball exposure, it lacked one essential piece - an academic component. Scott recognized that by not making it mandatory that players strive for academic excellence, along with athletic development, players would gain a false sense of what was necessary for success in life. Using this as his foundation, Scott designed a program which not only requires the players to have passing grades, but to maintain an 80 grade point average. According to Scott, Scott's All*Stars was created not to be a basketball program, but an academic program that incorporates basketball training and exposure, while ensuring students are exhibiting academic excellence. Scott also wanted the players to always feel a need to give back to the community. This prompted him to add a community service element to his program.

Scott's vision became a reality on January 15, 2010, when Scott's All*Stars program held it first tryouts conducted by president Marcus Scott, IV, head coach Daryl West and assistant coaches Khari Collins and Kevin Corwick. The program has grown from 12 young men in its first year, to four teams of over 40 players last year. This year, due to funding and the number of qualified coaches, Scott's All*Stars only had two teams of 16 players. The quality of this program is now known throughout the state of Georgia which is a testament to the commitment of its founder and coaching staff, the hard work of its players, and the support of its parents.

Scott's All*Stars continues its pursuit of academic and athletic distinction by teaching players that average is below average and excellence is what is expected. Attending college is a goal that is engrained into the young men at an early age and cultivated by Scott's All*Stars. Mr. Scott feels that the earlier kids start thinking about college, the more likely they will attend college. This is why on every road trip Scott's All*Stars' players are given the opportunity to visit local universities. They have visited colleges around the country, traveling to places such as New York and California. It is during college trips that students gain lifelong experiences that are unforgettable.

Scott's All*Stars is not a basketball program, but an academic program that incorporates basketball training and exposure, while ensuring students are exhibiting academic excellence. Scott All*Stars' coaches are committed to working with players until they graduate from high school and attend college. The team's goal is for all players to receive college scholarships for academics, basketball, or both! Scott's All*Stars is committed to making sure all kids who remain in the program from elementary to high school graduation receive college scholarships. All players are expected to not only attend college, but graduate from a four-year institution. Mr. Scott and his staff will continue to provide academic assistance until they graduate from high school and in college, if necessary.

In its first year, Scott's All*Stars quickly became a premier program with many established organizations mimicking the blueprint that has made Scott's All*Stars successful. Our teams are committed to the ABC's of Scott's All*Stars: Academics first, which is evident by our program overall average GPA of 87 for three years in a row; Basketball training, which is evident by our team success on the court, having a player ranked in the national in our program and a team that placed in the Top 8 in the nation and playing in over 200 games in 3 years; Community Service and College visits. Our players have completed over 100 hours of community service and visited over thirty colleges in three years; Drug Prevention and Dedicated mentors. We teach drug prevention and all of our coaches are dedicated mentors. Furthermore, we provide Educational assistance to any student whose grades fall below an 80 GPA.

Also eight out of eight of our seniors went to college, in the military, or received a scholarship with our first 2012 graduating class. Four players received athletic scholarships, one received academic scholarship, two will be attending college, and one will be joining the military. We feel if we can have these result with one year of working with juniors in high school, kids that started with us in the fourth grade will definitely receive an academic and/or athletic scholarship.

During our 2014 season we had four teams. Our 8th grade team proved to be the strongest team finishing with a 40-5 regular season record before competing in Nationals. We assisted over forty kids during our fifth year. Our program continues to be the model for running a successful program that focuses on academics and athletics.




